Pérez (D-Los Angeles)	Student financial aid: Middle class scholarship program	Scheduled for a hearing before the Assembly Higher Ed committee on 5/1/12	Creates the Middle Class Scholarship Program under the administration of the Student Aid Commission. Beginning with the 2012-13 year, UC and CSU undergrads whose family incomes are \$150,000 or less and are state residents, would receive a package of financial aid covering at least 2/3 of tuition and fees.

Would require schools to provide free or reduced-price meals at all campus locations where lunch is available in order to protect low-income students from being stigmatized and possibly not eating or eating unhealthy food.

Makes it easier for school districts to access student data achievement data from charter schools within their district boundaries. Requires for-profit private colleges to inform prospective students where they are accredited by an agency recognized by the U.S. and California and, if not, what the limitations of the degrees are.
